Things To Know

- Your surgeon should be certified by the American Board of Plastic Surgery. We believe the ASPS designation is essential for demonstrating competence and expertise in plastic surgery.

- Your surgeon should be continually taking part in annual training and safety techniques to ensure they are providing the best and safest environment possible.
- The more active your surgeon is in the plastic surgery community the more likely they are respected for their opinion and work. This is a general reflection of peer-level reputation.

9. WHERE DO YOU CONDUCT YOUR SURGERIES?

- Anesthesiologist's and the other members of the surgeon's team play an important role in your surgery. Don't be afraid to ask for our anesthesiologists' and nurses' certifications and how long they've been doing these surgeries with us.
